

DP: Emily Stockwell, El Paso 911 Operator

UM: Unidentified Male

OP: 911. This call is being recorded. Where is your

emergency?

UM: This is the killer (muffled sounds, heavy breathing).

I killed her, Rose, Rose (unidentifiable), I..did it.

OP: What's your name, sir?

UM: Name? My name is... (heavy breathing) Death.

DP: Okay. What is your real name, sir?

UM: You'll find her in her home. She looks so beautiful.

Now.

DP: Sir, where is this home?

UM: She could tell you but she's lost her head.

OP: Sir. where are you located?

UM: You'll find me under the bed. Under the stairs.

OP: Sir. where are you located?

UM: I am in the shadows. And I'll kill again.

SHERIFF JOSEPH R. COATES: Known around Ambrose County simply as "Joe Bob," Sheriff Coates assumed the role of Sheriff in July of 1988 when his predecessor, Sam Cooper was gunned down in cold blood by his brother, Walt. Since that time, Sheriff Coates has "been the acting sheriff and is running to be elected for the position for the first time in March of 1992. He is fair and just though conflicted about his love of the place he calls home and the evil it continues to generate.

LUCINDA "LU" GORMAN: Lu has been with the sheriff's office in Ambrose County since 1979 where she quickly cemented herself as an integral member of the staff. Though childless herself, she helped raise Patti Doyle after Patti's mother, Shirley, fell

DEPUTY WILSON HART: Often jokingly referred to as the "heart" of the sheriff's office, Wilson Hart has been Sheriff Coates' right hand man since grade school. When times get tough, Sheriff Coates turns to Wilson for answers - and Wilson is more than happy to give them.

PATRICIA "PATTI" DOYLE: Ambrose Countian Patti Doyle Studied out of State at UCLA Law. She was subsequently offered a position at a prestigious firm in Los Angeles, though she politely declined, citing her desire to work for the people of her home state. Following graduation, Patti moved back to Ambrose County Into a small house rented to her by her father's friend, Edgar Willows.

CHARLES "KING" BENCHLEY: Known throughout the region as the affable "West Texas Above Grown Pool King," Benchley has made a name for hitself in darker circles as "King" - an unfortunate tribute to his obsession with Elvis Prisley. Over several years, Benchley has quietly taken over much of the West Texas drug trade with an eye to extending his reach to ther in the days to come.
